TERMS OF PUBLISHING PAPERS IN THE JOURNAL "MEDYCYNA PRACY"

INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS OF MANUSCRIPTS IN ENGLISH http://medpr.imp.lodz.pl/instructions

Bimonthly "Medycyna Pracy", published since 1950, is an organ of the Polish Society of Occupational Medicine and the Nofer Institute of Occupational Medicine in Łódź. The rules governing the procedure of publishing papers in the journal are adjusted to the "Uniform requirements towards papers intended for publication in biomedical journals" developed by the International Committee of Medical Journals Editors (formerly the Vancouver Group) (http://www.icmje.org/urm_main.html).

I. GENERAL

- "Medycyna Pracy" publishes original papers, review papers, and case studies. In English may be submitted only original papers and case studies (for instructions concerning articles in Polish see: Instrukcje dla Autorów manuskryptów w języku polskim). There are also published communications and reports from conferences, congresses and symposia, book reviews, letters to the editor, information about academic degrees, honors and awards in the field of occupational medicine, occupational hygiene and public health.
- The articles published in "Medycyna Pracy" are reviewed. The appropriate form and instructions for reviewers are made available to the public (http://medpr.imp.lodz.pl/Instructions-for-Reviewers,44.html).
- 3. Articles published in the journal are the property of the publisher Nofer Institute of Occupational Medicine, Łódź which acquires the exclusive copyright to the printed papers (including the right to publish them in the printed form, via electronic media and on the Internet). In relation to the above, the Authors shall not be paid any royalties. Reproduction of all papers or their fragments for commercial purpose may be made only after obtaining the consent of the editorial office.
- The article should be submitted via Editorial System (http://www.editorialsystem.com/medpren). It is free of charge.

II. SPECIFIC RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Agreement on the transfer of proprietary rights

The authors should submit via the Editorial System the Agreement signed by all authors. The form of the agreement is available in the Editorial System (step "Agreement") after logging in. Submitting the signed agreement means that the author/s agree(s) with the reservations included in paragraph III of those terms. According to the form, please indicate the input of the individual authors (including the information on the author of its concept, assumptions, methods used, etc.), while preparing the publication. Ghostwriting and guest authorship are a sign of scientific misconduct, and as such will be publicized by the editorial board by notifying the institutions employing the authors, scholarly societies, etc. Works will not be passed to Reviewers unless the agreement is submitted via Editorial System.

2. The title page

It should contain: 1) a running title, i.e., a short title (max 50 characters including spaces); 2) the title of the article in English and Polish; 3) name and surname of the author/authors; 4) affiliation, i.e., the name of the author's workplace and the organizational unit in English and Polish; 5) full data of the first author for correspondence (including e-mail address); 6) the number and title of the program/research/grant under which the study has been carried out and the sources of funding used for the publication; 7) alternatively acknowledgments.

3. The form of the manuscript

Editors accept works prepared in Microsoft Word or Open Office, 12-point Times New Roman font, 1,5-spaced, prepared in A4 format.

The authors should submit the editable electronic copies of: 1) the original manuscript, 2) the title page, 3) files with editable tables, 4) files with editable figures.

ABSTRACT: Up to 250 words in English and Polish.

In the case of original papers, the abstract should have a structural form, i.e., it should be divided into: Background, Material and Methods, Results, Conclusions).

KEY WORDS: 6 in English and Polish (according to the Medical Subject Headings – MeSH).

ORIGINAL PAPERS: Their subject is to present the methods and results of their own research and thorough evaluation and the reference to other research on the topic. They should include the following sections:

- Introduction: State of knowledge on the subject, formulated research aim.
- Material and Methods, Results: Shown clearly, with reference to the tables or figures contained therein.
- Discussion: With an indication of the extent to which the research aims were reached, and with references linking the research to other researches connected with the subject.
- **Conclusions:** Should refer to the established aims of the paper.

REFERENCES: Up to 30 items in the original study – should take into account the full references of all of the publications (including legal acts, websites, etc.), referred to by the author in the text. Avoiding citation of own publications allows to preserve anonymity in the process of paper evaluation by reviewers. Reference should be included in the text at the point of reference to the text on the item of literature (Arabic numerals in square brackets), consistent with the order of citation. In the case of another citation of the same item, the same number should be given. Examplary references:

- in the case of books: Pałczyński C. Occupational allergy in healthcare workers. Łódź: Nofer Institute of Occupational Medicine; 2002.
- for chapters in the book: Meltzer PS, Kallioniemi A, Trent JM. Chromosome alterations in human solid tumors. In: Vogelstein B, Kinzler KW, editors. The genetic basis of human cancer. New York: McGraw-Hill; 2002. p. 93–113.
- in case of electronic sources: additionally publishing year (and month if it is known), citation date and the access path, e.g., European Food Safety Authority (EFSA). Scientific opinion on polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDEs) in food. Parma, Italy 2011 [cited 2013 Aug 30]. Available from: http://www.efsa.europa.eu.

Complete rules concerning literature are available in International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) at http://www.nlm.nih.gov/ bsd/uniform_requirements.html.

TABLES: Should be developed using the tools to create tables in Microsoft Word or Open Office and numbered (Arabic numerals). The titles and content of the tables should be prepared in English and Polish, including a footnote explaining the abbreviations used in the tables. Tables should be numbered chronologically. The place of referring to a table in the main text should be marked with its number (e.g., Table 1).

FIGURES: Should be black and white, made in vector format (eps, pdf, ai or cdr) and sent via Editorial System in bitmap format (jpg, gif, tif, bmp or png). Descriptions should be prepared in Arial or Myriad font in 2 versions: transformed and not transformed into curves. Signatures and content of the drawings and explanations for them should be prepared in English and Polish. Figures should be numbered chronologically (Arabic numerals). The place of referring to the figure in the main text should be marked with its number (e.g., Figure 1).

SOURCE OF DATA: With respect to all the data from other publications or unpublished sources that are in the main text of the article, tables and figures, the source of origin should be indicated. In case of putting a table or a figure of another author/s, it is necessary to attach the approval of the publisher for such table or figure to be reprinted free of charge.

4. Author's proof and a copy for the author

Following the composition of the text, the author for correspondence receives the article in a PDF file. The author within the deadline set by the publisher is obliged to make and send to the publisher the author's proof, which includes only the corrections of the errors in composition. If the proof is not sent within the deadline set by the publisher, it shall have the right to issue and distribute the article in the form sent for author's proofreading, and the author shall not have the right to make any claims in respect of any uncorrected errors.

Following the publication of the journal issue, the publisher sends the link to the article in the pdf format to the e-mail address of the author for correspondence. The addressee is obliged to make it available to the co-authors (if any).

III. RESERVATIONS

- 1. Submitting the signed agreement via the Editorial System means that the author/s declare(s) that:
 - he has/they have read the full text of the Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial 3.0 Poland license (also known as CC-BY-NC) available at http://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc/3.0/pl/deed.en;
 - 2) the article, including tables/figures/photographs/appendices (except those listed in point 7 of this paragraph), is the result of his/their original creative work, and he/they are entitled to exclusive and unrestricted copyright to the article and that by the date of the Agreement he has/they have not take any commitments that would limit or waive his/their right to the article;
 - he is not/they are not member/s of an organization of collective management of copyright and he has not/they have not concluded an agreement with an organization of such kind for the management of copyright;
 - 4) he/they placed in the article on the title page full information about the source of funding (including the number and title of the project/ research/grant, the name and the title/degree of the project manager) and other financial relationships with any organization or person with a direct financial contribution into the subject of the research or examined materials discussed in the article (e.g., through employment, consultancies, stock ownership, honoraria);

- 5) the article has not been previously published in any form or submitted for publication in another publishing house or editorial office;
- 6) the article does not contain statements inconsistent with the law;
- 7) all the necessary permits for the citations of other sources (citations beyond the so-called quotation law referred to in Article 29 § 1 of the Act of 4 February 1994 on Copyright and Related Rights) and others have been obtained by the author/s and attached to the Agreement (the declaration of the author of the photographs Appendix No. 1 to the Agreement, the consent to using an image Appendix No. 2, the consent allowing for a reprint Appendix No. 3, the consent allowing for a translation and its reprint Appendix No. 4);
- there are no other circumstances that could expose the publisher to any liability to any third parties arising from the publication or distribution of the article;
- he/they accept(s) publisher's rights to make technical and linguistic editing without consulting them with the author/s, and also to shorten the submitted manuscripts;
- 10) he/they authorize(s) the publisher to make reprints of the article without the author's proof and to determine the manner of distribution, price, number of editions and the number of carriers in the various editions, the type of binding and graphic design, in which the article will be distributed, and to advertise products of the publisher or third parties.
- 2. The author/s bear(s) full responsibility for the veracity of these statements. In the event a third party makes claims against the publisher in connection with the use of the article or disposal of the rights to the article, the author/co-authors shall undertake to join the proceedings as soon as he is/they are informed of this fact by the publisher, as well as to pay immediately, not later than within 14 days of the receipt of a written notice from the publisher, any costs incurred in this respect by the publisher and in particular the cost of damages, remedies, court costs and costs of legal assistance. This obligation includes the obligation of the author/s to cover all documented damages, including those resulting from the judicial or extra-judicial settlements or court ruling.
